NOTES FROM CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING 19th JANUARY 2021

- Dianne Peberdy opened the meeting at 7.30 pm.
- Pam led devotions based on readings about light and hope, followed by prayer.
- It was reported that Jill, Unity and Meff took 8 students from Highgate Park for a beach walk and lunch at the Somerton Kiosk. This was greatly appreciated.
- Approval was given to serve tea, coffee and lamingtons (Covid style) on 24th January
- Also agreed that we will re-start the Coffee Roster from 7th February
- We will contact all of the Hirers regarding their return to the use of the building.
- The Draft Financial Reports for December were received and discussed Dianne gave a verbal report of the Finance Committee meeting which she and Angela had attended and we discussed and approved their recommendations for both the Year-end report and the 2021 Budget.
- The amount to be paid quarterly by Playgroup/mainly music has been adjusted. They will now contribute \$300 per quarter towards building running costs.
- The Joint Nominating Committee continues with the process, meeting regularly.
- We began forward planning for the AGM noted that there will be two vacancies on Church Council.
- Lenten Studies will commence in the week beginning 15th February Tony Nancarrow has chosen a study book which runs for 6 sessions.
- An invitation has been received from The Initiating Group for the Unley Uluru Statement Support Group to participate in ecumenical study groups to discuss an 8 part study *A Voice in the Wilderness*. This explores the background to the Uluru Statement from the Heart.
- Synod Property Services have indicated that we have outstanding issues which need to be addressed. Bob has estimated that there is about \$4,500 worth of extra work to be completed this year. This will be actioned.
- Staff in Synod office now able to assist and have agreed to complete the necessary steps to enable the Website to be completed and up and running.
- Members were reminded that items for the Annual Report are due on 31st January.
- The meeting closed at 9.35 pm.

CITIZEN OF THE YEAR:

On Tuesday 26th January (Australia Day, 2021) ,Jenny Cooper, was named as City of Burnside's Citizen of the Year for 2021

Jenny was recognised for her efforts in starting up the Australian branch of Breadtags for Wheelchairs, a not-for-profit organisation which collects bread tags and recycles them to raise funds.

Jenny, of Rosslyn Park, set up a national collection network and engaged a local recycler, Transmutation in Robe, to produce bread boards, bowls and platters.

By September 2020 Aussie Breadtags for Wheelchairs had recycled over 2 tonnes of breadtags,

(approximately 5.4 million) and in that time has funded 14 wheelchairs. It was quite humbling to receive the Award," Jenny says.
