
WOMEN ON WEDNESDAY

New books in the Rosefield Church Library:

Four new titles from the series "Out of the depths" (one pictured here)

The Out of the Depths series addresses common pastoral crises in a faithful, encouraging, and factual manner that provides support to parishioners in crisis beyond the initial pastoral conversation. Each booklet begins with a thoughtful consideration of the topic at hand, which is followed up by 30 brief devotions. The thirty short devotions creates a sense of companionship and hope in a difficult and lonely time. Knowing they are sharing a resource written by mental health professionals and pastors with personal experience provides a trustworthy source of information.
