Happy Birthday Rosefield Church! 110 years at this Worship Site....what a joy to celebrate together today. Reading Past UCA President Al McRae's address to Rosefield at the Centenary service in 2011, he said, "The church at its best ... is where the Spirit ministers to us in our upper rooms of worship on the Lord's Day, then blows us out into the world where we lose ourselves to the greater cause of bearing witness to Jesus in the power of the Holy Spirit." As we gaze upon the activities of Rosefield congregation in our Newsletter, we can see evidence of the health of this congregation in our striving to being the best we can be for the kingdom of God that Jesus reveals in Scripture and through our experiences of God's love from others. Today we gather to celebrate our Anniversary and to give thanks for the witness and work of those who have gone before us and to hear of God's Love for us, amidst the complexities of our lives. We gather on the Lord's Day, the day of resurrection, taking our place as Easter people - followers of the living Lord Jesus - offering ourselves to receive his love and his life, that we might serve his way. Pastoral Partners

One of Rosefield's strengths is the Pastoral Partners program, that ensures members have a trusted carer who makes contact now and then, and through whom, our joys and concerns can be shared. Christine Nancarrow is the coordinator, and the program is over-sighted by a small group of people who have pastoral gifts and have trained in the program, which was written by Sharonne Price. Every so often as people retire as leaders, and as new people join our community, there is a need to rearrange the care lists. New people are encouraged to speak to Christine or the Minister about their pastoral care. The pastoral care exists will be reviewed as our new Minister arrives.

Spending time in Hospital? When you or your loved one go to hospital, be sure to tell them you are a Uniting church person and would like a chaplain to visit with you during your stay. For some years now, those being admitted are no longer asked about their religion or if a chaplain's visit would be welcomed. Chaplains will only know people from the church are present, if we say something to the admissions clerk. Chaplains do stroll the wards and gently engage with patients. They are sensitive to patients' needs, and will offer prayer, which can often be a source of comfort in a vulnerable time. They can also bring Holy Communion.

Chaplains arrive at the foot of our hospital beds, bringing Christ's love and care to us, in our hour of need.

Sylas' story

Last week during the Anzac Day sharing, Rev Sue asked the congregation to pray for Sylas, from New Jersey, who had come to a firm faith during a 5 week stay in Adelaide with Christian family friends. Sylas is 18 years of age, has suffered Hodgkin Lymphoma, and as a child watched many friends made during extensive chemotherapy, die. He later suffered depression and anxiety and began to self-harm. He struggled with gender identity, finally identifying himself as a man. Raised in a Christian home, he gave up on God and became an



atheist, then agnostic and then searched for meaning in Buddhism, and crystals, before being drawn back into a journey with Christ. Last Monday afternoon, Rev Sue and Rev Sandy Boyce baptised Sylas at Seacliff beach, with members of the Pilgrim Uniting Church present to welcome him into their online congregation. Sylas returns to the US to attend University in Pennsylvania this week. Please pray for God to protect and guide him to a welcoming congregation.
