## Alleluia! Jesus is Alive!

After weeks of drawing nearer to Jerusalem, and a Holy Week filled with varied experiences of joy and betrayal, meal sharing and death, this day brings a new and an entirely unexpected situation. The tomb is empty! What are we to make of it? Those closest to Jesus were shocked and frightened, amazed and fearful. How are we to respond, remembering that our journey through Easter is not yet complete?

Tradition has it that Easter Sunday is the pinnacle and culminating event of the Christian church calendar, full of celebration and joy at death conquered.

And yet on that first Easter Sunday morning, was it so certain? Can we relate to the fear and surprise of finding unexpected things? With grieving hearts and ready to administer burial rites following tradition, the women disciples are confronted by a radical new reality. The stone is rolled away, and a strange man wearing white dazzling clothes speaks to them! Already a new transformational journey has begun– a journey that cannot contain the Spirit of Christ within normal plans, traditions, and expectations of how things should be. It is a journey of the heart.

Can this be an Easter message for us today? Encounters with the Christ draw us into new perspectives, new directions, new understandings, new ways of compassion. Jesus is alive - his Spirit transforms our hearts and our minds, and empowers our capacity to love and serve the kingdom of God in new and creative ways. Empowering Rosefield, in the heart of Highgate to discover where Jesus might be at work here in Highgate, out among the community, and to not only offer Jesus' love in this place, but in every place where we see the risen Christ at work!
