
Pentecost

The outpouring of God's Spirit reveals a whole new world order as on the day of Pentecost, believers are filled with the Holy Spirit, and they start to praise God in various languages, as tongues of fire are seen coming upon them. The Gospel of John hints at the coming of this day with its account of Jesus' promise of the gift of the Holy Spirit whose presence and action will be life-giving, not just for the followers of Christ, but for the whole world. In recent times, Pentecost has largely been presented, as a personal "second blessing" experience that "fills" or "baptises" us with God's Spirit. How does this represent an omnipresent God, or a God who is present everywhere all the time? Richard Rohr says, "God is either everywhere or nowhere". Perhaps Pentecost is better seen as an outpouring of awareness of the Spirit of God that has always been the sustaining breath of creation. Individualistic views of Pentecost can easily lead to rather un-Christlike attitudes of superiority, judgment and exclusivity. The Pentecost moment is more far-reaching and significant than just a personal experience of blessing. To be open to the Pentecost Spirit means opening ourselves to connection with others and the entire created order, as well as to God. This means that we receive God's gift as an empowerment which comes with a responsibility to grow in love, to grow in compassion and respect for other people, for all creatures and for the earth. Then, living out of this empowerment, we will choose the ways of Jesus that are life-bringing to the whole creation, and to our ourselves as well.

Please welcome to our service today the Chaplain for the Kurlana Tapa Youth Detention Centre, Jess Kaucz. Jess attends the Encounter Uniting Church at Prospect, which started as a church plant by Rev Mike Wardrop, who had served the Synod as our Youth and Young Adults Resource person.
