I built a large fire and huddled in close. Once the fire was out, I hopped into my freezing swag and spent the night enjoying the cold. I like to experience the weather. I love feeling the icy coldness of the wind or the rain. Not only does stepping back into the car feel warm (and safe), the experience in the wind is thrilling. These moments make me feel alive.

After a cold night in the swag, I stood in the morning sunshine. I felt the warmth of the sun defrosting my fingers and entering my body. I felt connected with God and with the world. In the Gospels, Jesus consistently says, 'with eyes to see and ears to hear, the kingdom of God is all around'. I think the Gospels are about noticing the world around us. When we notice and pay attention, we experience something of God.

As you go through your week, I pray you may take a moment to notice the sensation of the weather. Notice it and how it feels. Notice it and wonder how this reveals something of God to you.
