Pilgrim UCA Circle of Friends

The Pilgrim based Circle of Friends 27 catered a memorial service held at our church this past week. The Circle of Friends is one of over sixty groups established to provide a variety of support for refugees and asylum seekers, both in the community and/or in detention and operates in association with the Australian Refugee Association (ARA) and Amnesty International.

Members of Circle 27 come mainly from the Pilgrim congregation; however, membership is open to anyone who seeks to support refugees in the community and in detention.

Anyone who feels that refugees and asylum seekers ought to be treated with human dignity and who genuinely wants to help may become a member or come along to the Adelaide Eight Years of Harm event.

Sunday 18th July at 2pm.

We will meet at Tarntanyangga / Victoria Sq for a walk to the Vietnamese Boat People Monument, with speakers, including those detained, at the walk finish. We will call for an end to indefinite detention, and for all those who were taken offshore and are still being 'processed', to be given the freedom to settle in Australia or New Zealand.
