G'day folks,

I will also be re-reading that excellent Rosefield 100th anniversary book (and another one on Adelaide one of you gave me) and my Bible.

I find it essential to take time to retreat. To pull back and reflect. Ministry gets busy, and starting in a new city, with a new community is a lot of new information. I find it helpful to step back and reflect. To put the information in order and pray through conversations I've had. The old saying about seeing the mountain from the valley and the valley from the mountain, the need to step out to reflect is vitally important.

Speaking of mountains, the Season of Creation ploughs ahead. This week our prayer relates to mountains. I've included it below. In October, we have our Gifted Generosity program starting. This is an opportunity to reflect on God's abundance and care for creation. We will reflect on our part here at Rosefield, and you will be invited to help shape our future. One of the joys in my first few months has been working with the Gifted Generosity team in creating this program. Scott will have more information coming soon. We have some very gifted people in our congregation (including you, dear reader). I've been so impressed with the way people have shared their gifts and time. We have a top-notch brochure, a prayer vigil, stories and probably a sermon or three. All of these things reflect on God's generosity and our response. It does include finance and more. It includes time and gifts, care and love.

COVID-19 UPDATE

<u>Singing</u> Attendees at indoor religious services may sing during worship and members of choirs or chorus groups may perform or rehearse indoors, if they wear masks while doing so.

Density requirements and additional directions:

- Density requirement for seated activities is now 3 per 4 square metres. This applies to churches services
- Density requirement for standing activities remains at 1 per 2 square metres
- Gyms and indoor fitness activities remains at 1 per 4 square metres
- Private gatherings in homes remain limited to 20 people
- Weddings, funerals and birthdays are capped at 50 people (at non-residential premises)
- Wearing of masks remains mandatory in high risk settings, personal care and health care services, passenger and public transport, secondary schools, and indoor public places this includes churches

Churches are advised to continue to follow their updated COVID Safe Plan that they will receive from the government.

- Dianne welcomed all to the meeting.
- Nora led devotions, using words from John 1: 1-5 and selected readings from Richard Rohr as a focus, followed by prayer.
- Minutes from 17th August had been circulated and were accepted as an accurate record.
- The financial reports for August 2021 were accepted.
- Pleasing to note that the retiring offering in support of the Red Dove Café raised \$708.80 and we have also received a further donation from the Cycling Group of \$500.
- Following the Congregation meeting, the required documentation for the purchase of a Manse was sent to the Synod Property Committee.
- Noted that restrictions regarding COVID protocols for worship have not been changed seating as before and singing with masks on.
- Rev. Richard Telfer tabled his report noting that he will be on leave from 22/9 6/10 inclusive.
- With sadness we record the death of Barbara McDonald we will celebrate her life at Rosefield on 27th September and Rev Sue Ellis will officiate.
- The Mission Plan for 2022 2023 was adopted.
- Preparations for the Gifted Generosity program are on track.
- Bob reported on a few property issues and it was noted that the Test and Tag as requested by Synod had now been done.
- Letter of appreciation for our Congregation's contribution to the Mission and Service Fund in 2020 has been received from Synod.
- We will be participating in the National Church Life Survey on Sunday 7th November.
